ARRIVED: YOUTH WITH A MISSION HAITI We Believe This Nation Is Called To Be A Blessing ~ Zechariah 8:13

Dear Family and Friends,

Wow! We did it: We got everything purchased and packed up; we spent a week driving across country in a U-Haul truck with our cat; and we made to the plane on time and flew to Haiti as a family. Our first days were filled with settling in tasks like

hanging mosquito nets, putting up screens on the doors and figuring where everything should go in the house. Then, I went back to work in the accounting department and Curtis began his new job with the transportation department. A month later and we are slowly settling into a routine, albeit one that is disrupted by various challenges (like Curtis' brand new computer dying). Timothy has adjusted well, making friends with the kids on base, swimming to keep cool, and hanging out. Baby, our cat, spends lots of time on the tile floor keeping cool and the rest of his time looking longingly out the windows, hoping to escape and chase the chickens. Our biggest challenge is learning Creole. We have lessons twice a week and slowly are being able to put together sentences to ask basic questions like, "How are you?" and "What did you do this morning?"

In each of our newsletters, I want to highlight one of YWAM Haiti's ministries to give you a better idea of what God is doing in and through this mission. This month the spotlight is on our Creole teacher, Ronald Louis (pronounce this with a French accent and you've got it right). Ronald's story highlights one of the focuses of YWAM Haiti: To train up Haitian young people and see them become a blessing to their nation and the world. Ronald, who is twenty-eight, gave his life to the Lord when he was fourteen. In 2007, he joined YWAM's pre-DTS program, where young people have the opportunity to learn more about God and grow in relationship with Him. He completed his Discipleship Training School (DTS) in 2009, with an outreach to the Dominican Republic. This inspired him to seek more training

and he attended Fisherman International Seminary in Port au

Prince, where he spent three years studying the Bible and learning to effectively communicate the gospel. Now, he has begun to pursue a vision God gave him when he was a teenager.

"When I was eighteen I had a vision where God showed a lot of people and I was standing in the middle of them. Where I was standing I was reaching out to the people around me and heard God say to me, 'I am going to give you the resources you need to reach these people; help them with everything I have given you."

Coming back to St. Marc, the city of his birth, Ronald felt a call to start a church in Timonette. Timonette is located just

outside the city of St. Marc, in an area called the Fifth Section, where hundreds of victims from the 2010 earthquake were relocated and now live. Before the earthquake, Timonette was a village of a little more than 2,000 people, whose primary source of income was fishing and harvesting rice. When YWAM purchased a large piece of land and began building Homes of Hope for the earthquake victims, the population doubled. Unfortunately, there is much tension between the original inhabitants and the newcomers. Ronald's passion is to see all the people of Timonette give their lives to Jesus and live in unity as the Bible teaches.

Please be praying for Ronald as he ministers daily and as his congregation expands.
